## Geology of the Baraboo Area: What the Rocks Tell Us about Landmark, 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Wisconsin's Ancient Past

About one-and-a-half billion years ago, Wisconsin was situated near the coast of an ancient continent covered by flowing rivers and sandy beaches. Evidence for these ancient environments is preserved in rock outcrops and historic mine records from the Baraboo Hills. Through compiling this evidence into new geologic maps, we gain an understanding of ancient Earth environments before the evolution of animal life as well as how this oldest bedrock influences southern Wisconsin's groundwater resources.
